Jerome "Jerry" R. Jurkowski passed away on July 12, 2017 after a short illness at Klover Korner Farm in rural Rockton, Illinois. He was born April 17, 1938 in Worth, Illinois, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Adam and Marion (Gierszewioz) Jurkowski. Jerry married Kathi Linden on December 17, 1976. They were married 41

years.

Jerry was a veteran of the U.S. Marines Corp. He was the former owner of Hootman Dental Lab and served as the president of the Illinois Dental Lab Association, an honorary member of the Winnebago Dental Society, a member of the Winnebago County Farm Bureau serving on the Farm Service Agency Committee, and a member of Rotary International Committee, Pheasants Forever, Great Lakes Belted Galloway Association, and the Belted Galloway Society.

In 1989, Jerry and Kathi retired to Klover Korner Farm in Rockton, Illinois after many years in the dental industry. Jerry grew up on a farm and it was his desire to return to his heritage. They purchased their land and farm and began to renovate the barns, build a home, and add Belted Galloway cattle to their operation. Conservation of the land was very dear to Jerry's heart and he modeled his fields and pastures to benefit wildlife, cattle, and crop production. Jerry and Kathi soon learned about Belted Galloway cattle in *Country* magazine.

In those early years, Belted Galloway cattle were not plentiful in the United States. To increase their herd, they traveled throughout the United States and to Canada. They imported animals from the Green Arpents Farm owned by H. Gordon Green. Jerry soon became very active in the Belted Galloway breed. He was a founding director of the Great Lakes Belted Galloway Association and served as the breed superintendent at World Beef Expo in Wisconsin. The Jurkowskis hosted many events for the GLBGA, including their annual field day. Jerry served two-terms on the Belted Galloway Council and hosted the 1993 Annual Meeting of the Belted Galloway Society, Inc. Klover Korner cattle were featured in *Country Woman* magazine. In 2004, Klover Korner welcomed many international guests as part of the Galloway Getaway International Conference in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Over the years, the Jurkowskis traveled to over 200 Belted Galloway farms and participated in the Deep South Sale, the Select Sale and others. The Jurkowskis enjoyed a long history of showing Belted Galloway cattle and won many championships at World Beef Expo and the National Belted Galloway Show.

Survivors include his wife Kathi Jurkowski; daughter Jackie Lake; son Mike Jurkowski; stepsons Shawn Lopata and Bryan (Melanie) Lopata. Grandchildren: Nick Jurkowski, Jessica, Jennifer and Dan Lake, Madison, Jake, Emily and Carly Lopata and great-grandson Silas Jurkowski. Siblings: brother Ray (Barb) Jurkowski; sisters Rita Kot and Dorothy Gass; plus numerous nieces, nephews and friends.

Council Elections

Council elections will be held during the Annual General Meeting in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Janie Tripp (MS) has agreed to continue her valued work on the Council and Randy Hall (ME) and Jack Bagley (VA) have volunteered to serve a first term. They will all serve for a term of two years. Our members of Council work on a volunteer basis and we are appreciative of their willingness to serve. Regular and Lifetime members are eligible to vote either by mail prior to the deadline set forth on the ballot below or in person at the Annual General Meeting in Wisconsin in September. Each membership number is allowed one vote.

Jack Bagley (VA) and his wife, Delma, live in Sperryville and own a farm called Fields of Athenrye. The farm was named after a famous Irish ballad that befits their heritage. Jack grew up on a dairy farm in Pennsylvania. With his father's encouragement, he left the farm for college and a life that did not require the around the clock attention of a dairy operation. After a career in the private sector in government relations, Jack and Delma found a piece of property in the shadow of the Blue Ridge Mountains in the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia. Ten years ago, a vacation to Scotland resulted in his exposure to the Belted Galloway breed. Because of his early experience of living on a farm, a desire within prompted Jack to raise a breed of cattle that did not require the round-the-clock attention of a dairy farm, but at the same time allowed him to continue his consulting business that he began after retirement. Jack bought his first heifers from Red Gates Farm in Lexington, Virginia. He later purchased a bull from Driftwood Plantation in South Carolina. Jack and Delma, and their children and grandchild, maintain a small herd that ranges between 10-20 animals. Delma manages a horse, a few goats, chickens, and cats. They sell steers to farms in the area to raise for beef. They sell breeding stock to those who are interested in starting a herd or diversifying the genetics of existing herds. Jack has attended several annual meetings in Louisville. During 2016, he attended the Beltie Congress in Scotland. He has also purchased cattle at the National Sale in Fryeburg, Maine. Jack and Delma have served on various community service boards and volunteer organizations in the local area. They put their property into Easement, and they are supporters of the Piedmont Environment Council, the Shenandoah National

Park, and the Maine Coast Heritage Trust.

Randy Hall (ME) and his partner, Lori James, with their children Dustin and Meg, raise Belted Galloway and Hereford cattle at Pine View Farm in East Dixfield. Randy began raising Hereford cattle in 1978 and showed Herefords at the National level for many years before making the switch to Belted Galloway cattle in 1998. The herd now consists of approximately 35 head. The family exhibits their Belted Galloways all over the Northeast and as far away as Louisville, Kentucky. Randy is also the co-owner of Hall Farms Organic Dairy, a family tradition currently in its eighth generation. The family has maintained a herd of registered Holstein cattle since 1945, with original farm operations dating back to the early 1800's. In addition to their organic dairy operation, Randy and his brother, Rodney, also produce a large amount of Maine Maple Syrup, tapping approximately 7,000 trees. Outside of the farm, Randy is very active in the agricultural community. He currently serves as President of the New England Galloway Group, President of the Franklin County Agricultural Society, and recently finished his term as the President of the Maine Agricultural Fair Association. Additionally, Randy also serves as the chief of the local volunteer fire department. Randy is excited about his new venture on Council and looks forward to representing the breed in a professional manner.

Janie Tripp (MS) and her husband, Marty, have raised beef cattle since 2005. In 2009, they purchased Belted Galloway cattle and began Magnolia Trace Farm. Janie's goals are to produce, promote, and preserve high-quality Belted Galloway breeding stock. She was the first person to show Belted Galloway cattle at the Mississippi state show. Magnolia Trace Farm has participated in regional and national shows and sales. They sell breeding stock, semen, and feeder calves. Janie has held positions in the Lloyd Star FFA Alumni association and currently is treasurer of the Lincoln County Junior Livestock Association. Magnolia Trace Farm also has a small herd of registered Angus and Angus source commercial cattle. The farm raises high-quality Bermuda hay. Janie feels serving on Council is a great opportunity. During Janie's two-year term on Council, she has served as co-chairman of the Belted Galloway Junior Association Committee and she is on the Show and Sale Committee. She works to serve all breeders and to grow the Belted Galloway breed in her location of the country.

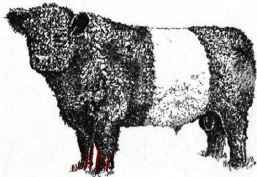

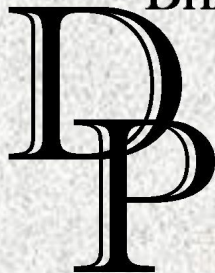
