- ◆ **Your classified's required contact information — name, farm, location, phone and email.** All classified ads are automatically placed on beltie.org with a two-month limit on classified insertions. Photos are \$10 placed on beltie.org only.

- ◆ **About bulls ...** Before advertising a young male be sure he is well conformed, tracks properly, has good legs and feet, and exhibits good weight gains. We should have data available on his birth weight, 205-day weaning weight, and yearling weight. If he's reached breeding age (around 18 months), it's definitely a plus to have his semen checked for quantity and motility, and uniform scrotal development (two normal sized testicles). Any data available should appear in your advertisement along with his birth date and the names of his sire and dam. **It is required that registration numbers be included on bulls advertised for sale in the classifieds.**

Mandatory Testing Requirements

Bulls

All bulls born on or after January 1, 2018 are required to be DNA and hypotrichosis tested before registration. Fees for the mandatory DNA and hypotrichosis testing are \$65. Bulls born on January 1, 2018 or after, will be registered with the CLRC for \$30 after the DNA and hypotrichosis testing has been completed. The Executive Director's office will notify you with the test results and the authorization for registration.

Requesting a DNA and Hypotrichosis Kit

DNA and hypotrichosis testing is handled through the Society office. To request the paperwork to initiate the test "kit" please use the following information as a reference.

1. Name of Animal
2. Tattoo

9. Type of test requested – DNA, hypotrichosis, or both

The Executive Director will use the data to generate the "kit" at the testing laboratory, review the "kit" for accuracy and send it to the applicant. There will be a kit provided for each animal. Specific instructions are included.

Samples, fees and testing results:

1. All samples (hair or semen) are to be sent to the official Laboratory. (Note: semen straws do not have to be frozen but need to be protected from breakage). All payments are to be sent to the Executive Director at the above address. No results will be released until payment has been received.
2. The test results are sent to the Executive Director, recorded then forwarded to the member. All DNA test results that are needed for registration, AI bulls semen certificates and embryo transfer animals and their dams are forwarded to CLRC.

Ron Howard Retires from Aldermere Farm



Ron Howard, Rockport, Maine retired in mid-October as General Manager at Aldermere Farm. Howard enjoyed a 17-year tenure expanding programs at the farm bequeathed by the late A. H. Chatfield, Jr. to the Maine Coast Heritage Trust. Mr. Chatfield began the Belted Galloway herd in 1953 when he imported the first animals.

Aldermere Farm is now home to over 100 Belted Galloway cattle and a small herd of sheep. On the 170-acre farm, volunteerism supports many programs that include the Aldermere Achievers 4-H Club, Cloverbuds, Teen Ag, Erikson Fields, and nature trails. 4-H youth lease or buy cattle and show animals locally and nationally. Gardening programs support food pantries, school

lunch programs, and restaurants. At Erikson Fields families are taught how to grown their own vegetables.



As a young boy, Howard grew up on Aldermere Farm. His father, Dwight, (pictured at left with Ron and wife Nancy) was the herd manager for 35 years when Mr. Chatfield owned the farm. Ron's daughter, Heidi Howard Baker, has been with Aldermere Farm since 2006, and the herd manager since 2012.

Ron has plans to continue spending time at Aldermere after he finishes building his retirement home. He commented about his favorite experiences with youth who are exposed to cattle and farming at Aldermere, "We see some of the kids come in meek and weak. Watching them blossom over the course of a year is the most enjoyable. We have seen that happen a number of times as kids relate with their animals and get passionate about them. At the start of the hay season, they can barely lift a bale. By the end of the season, they are so proud that they can lift it and throw it up in the air. That is just one component of it. There is the common sense they have to develop to solve problems and fix things. It is not just a nine-to-five job. If there is a job to do, you have to get it done. People exposed to farming develop those skills to get things done. It's not just the hard physical work, which I think is important, it's the maturity that lets these kids far surpass their peers when they leave."

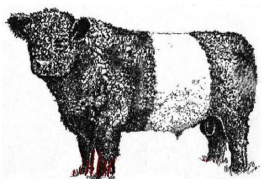

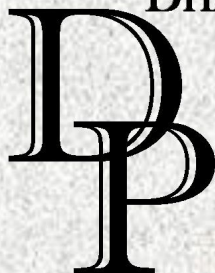
