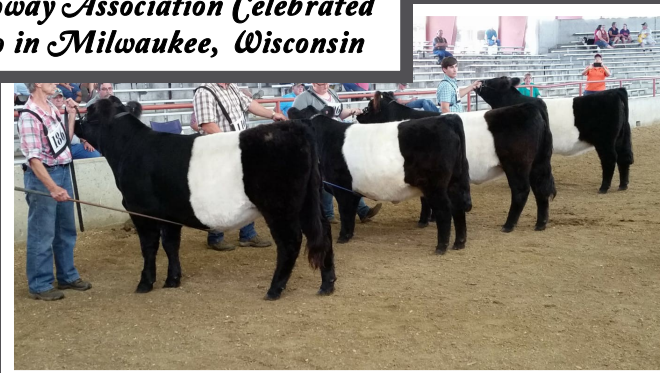




The Great Lakes Belted Galloway Association Celebrated 25 Years at World Beef Expo in Milwaukee, Wisconsin

What progress the Belted Galloway Society has made in the past five years. We have an updated, fresh, user-friendly, website full of valuable information and current events. Finally we have the ability to apply for registrations online with the CLRC. A revamp of the rules regarding mismarked female registrations now places them into our purebred herd book rather than recording them in the Appendix. Perhaps the most exciting development is our ability to begin to gather genetic information regarding parentage and genetic mutations like hypotrichosis.

I cannot begin to account for the time and effort put forth by so many people, from the members who initially pushed to address their concerns, to the volunteers who provided their time, energy, expertise, and leadership by serving on various working committees. This Council took very seriously their responsibility to the Society, the By-laws, and the membership, to reach the best decisions to move the Belted Galloway breed into the future and maintain the integrity and purity of the breed as best as possible. I have mentioned in general terms, as I fear by naming names; I will inadvertently leave someone out. You all deserve such a tremendous amount of credit. I offer my sincere gratitude

as a member of the Belted Galloway Society and as an officer of Council.

Nothing we do in agriculture seems easy anymore. Animal agriculture is constantly under the microscope. We observe many people stopping on the road in front of our farm to take pictures and videos of the cattle. We find ourselves questioning their intentions. Are these simply people that like the look of our striking belted cattle? Do they want to preserve and share what they see? Are they seeing something they take an issue with and are preparing to make a major (or minor) media attack of some sort against our farm? Are they just curious? Are they animal rights activists? How do you know? I do know Belted Galloway cattle draw more attention than many other breeds, and I think it is completely due to their distinct look. This is a fact not lost on every breeder.

One thing I have learned in my two terms as a member of this Council and serving as an officer, we are much stronger together. How we share information with each other is paramount. We need to be completely open with each other and not become regionalized if we hope to continue to move forward with acceptance of the breed by growing in animal numbers, breeder numbers, and improving the perception that we all deserve as cattlemen and women, not as hobbyists and amateurs. I have had the opportunity the

- ◆ **About bulls ...** Before advertising a young male be sure he is well conformed, tracks properly, has good legs and feet, and exhibits good weight gains. We should have data available on his birth weight, 205-day weaning weight, and yearling weight. If he's reached breeding age (around 18 months), it's definitely a plus to have his semen checked for quantity and motility, and uniform scrotal development (two normal sized testicles). Any data available should appear in your advertisement along with his birth date and the names of his sire and dam. **It is required that registration numbers be included on bulls advertised for sale in the classifieds.**

Mandatory Testing Requirements

BULLS

All bulls born on or after January 1, 2018 are required to be DNA and hypotrichosis tested before registration. Bull registration fees will change to \$30 on January 1, 2018.

DONOR COWS

All donor cows flushed on or after January 1, 2018 are required to be hypotrichosis tested.

2017 Fall Council Meeting

The 2017 fall Council meeting was called to order at 6 pm September 20, 2017 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin by President Greg Hipple. Secretary's Report. Registration data through July 31, 2017 as follows: Regular, 733; Junior, 117; Associate, 9; Life, 132. The following registration transactions were reported through July 31, 2017: Bulls, 152; Purebred Female, 752; Appendix, 58; Transfers, 634.

Treasurer's Report. Society funds in checking: \$52,340.75. Society funds in savings: \$10,890.81. Society funds in a certificate of deposit: \$135,372.08.

Advertising and Promotion – Chairman Jon Bednarski (KY)

The Belted Galloway Journal has been completed and was mailed first class in September. Bednarski has been working on the agenda for the 2020 World Galloway Congress in Louisville, KY. In addition to the events at the North American International Livestock Exposition, international guests will be invited to enjoy a river boat cruise on the Ohio River, a tour of local Belted Galloway farms, Buffalo Trace Distillery, the Kentucky Bluegrass Stockyards, and Churchill Downs. Beef Technology and Performance – Executive Director Vic Eggleston (WI)

Dr. Eggleston requested rule clarification of DNA and hypotrichosis testing. Council clarified the following rules:

BULLS: All bulls born on or after January 1, 2018 are required to be DNA and hypotrichosis tested before registration.

DONOR COWS: all donor cows flushed on or after January 1, 2018 are required to be hypotrichosis tested. Council moved that all the bulls that have been DNA tested be listed on the Belted Galloway Society web site.

Junior Belted Galloway Association – Chairman Janie Tripp (MS)

Awards have been ordered for the Kathi Jurkowski National Belted Galloway show in Louisville, KY. A junior meeting will be held with the youth at Louisville, KY. Items sold to benefit the BGJA national show have generated \$400. The GLBGA region 5 is selling items for fundraising for their youth group during the WBE Silent Auction. Magnolia Trace Farm (MS) is donating a heifer to be auctioned during the Midwest National Belted Galloway Sale to benefit the Belted Galloway Junior Association.

Society Show – Chairman Michelle Ogle

The 2017 World Beef Expo has 60+ cattle entered. Eastern States had over 73+ animals shown. Fryeburg Fair will be held in early October with 80+ animals entered. The national shows in Louisville will have a different show schedule during 2017. The junior show will be held before the open show on November 15, 2017 in Broadbent Arena. A fitting clinic for junior show will be held. Diane Gushee (ME) will assist with junior programs at Louisville. The National Open Show will again in Freedom Hall on November 16, 2017. A panel discussion will be held in Louisville for exhibitors and Belted Galloway members to ask questions that are Belted Galloway specific. Executive Director Vic Eggleston will be in attendance. The show committee will begin discussion of DNA testing Belted Galloway show champions. The committee will discuss and determine what point show venues would require testing.



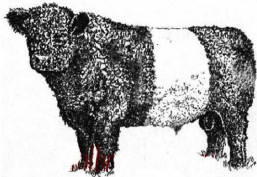

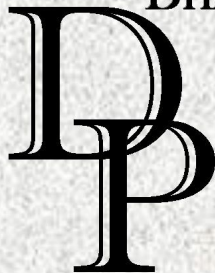
