Greetings fellow Belted Galloway enthusiasts. I would like to start by saying thank you all for allowing me to serve as your Council member. My name is Randy Hall and alongside my partner Lori, and our children Dustin and Meg, we raise Belted Galloways in East Dixfield, Maine.

I am currently enjoying my 20th year as a member of the Belted Galloway Society. I originally am an eighth-generation organic dairy farmer, still operating on the original farmland that began eight generations ago. Our family currently farms approximately 1,200 acres of land, harvesting oats, corn and hay. In addition, we also tap nearly 7,000 sugar maple trees and operate a thriving maple syrup business, Hall Farms Maple Products.

Though I have always had dairy cattle, I purchased my first Hereford during my sophomore year of high school and eventually grew my herd to over 50 registered Herefords. I showed Herefords competitively for several years all over the East Coast. In 1998, I purchased my first Belted Galloways in the National Belted Galloway Sale hosted by the New England Galloway Group. Those females, Aldermere



Manda and Mitchell Ledge Scarlett, were the start of a new-found passion. We quickly began showing our Belted Galloway cattle alongside our Hereford cattle. Today we continue to show our cattle on a national level and we have made connections with breeders from Maine to California. The unique culture of this breed makes it unlike any other and we are so thankful to be involved.

Off the farm, I am currently in my 21st year as the fire chief of the local volunteer fire department. I am also the past president of the Maine Agricultural Fair Association. Currently, I am the president of the Farmington Fair, as well as, the Beef Superintendent of Fryeburg Fair. I am also in the process of running for the Maine House of Representatives. My family and I are also very active in the New England Galloway Group of which I hold the position of president.

Over the next year, I look forward to meeting members and seeing those members of whom I have become so fond of over the last 20 years. I look forward to visiting with those of you who can attend the National

Belted Galloway Sale on April 21st.

Klover Korner Farm in Rockton, Illinois

Jerry and Kathi Jurkowski founded their Belted Galloway herd in 1989. Their early search for Belted Galloway cattle was very limited in the United States. They traveled to Canada several times and imported cattle from the Green Arpents herd. They also traveled throughout the United States and diversified their herd with Belted Galloway genetics. The Jurkowskis enjoyed many years of successfully showing their cattle. Thirty-plus years later, the Klover Korner herd continues to be maintained on the 200-acre farm. Jerry Jurkowski passed away in July 2017. Kathi has made many improvements enabling her to continue the herd and the Klover Korner Farm legacy.

Sunnybrook Farms in Belvidere, Illinois

For the past 16 years the Terry and Julie Willis family have based their Sunnybrook herd around 20 proven Belted Galloway females. The Willis family breeds their Belted Galloway cattle for the combination of quality, carcass, and conformation that will perform in the show ring and in the pasture. They have implemented the use of production records, DNA trait identification, and carcass results from ultrasound and slaughter data, and recently added IVF to further the predictability of the offspring produced in their herd. The family enjoys showing their herd nationally, and they are super excited to show their herd in their pasture!

Oak Valley Farm in Durand, Illinois

Oak Valley Farm is approaching their second decade of raising Belted Galloway cattle. Owners Mark and Cara Keller have a large family who all work together to manage their herd. The

Kellers have a long history of being active in the Belted Galloway breed and showing cattle. The Oak Valley herd is rotationally-grazed between two farms and they raise breeding stock and steers.

Double B Farm in Beloit, Wisconsin

2018 Louisville Belted Galloway Show Rule

1. NAILE will collect an entry fee of \$50/head entered and \$15 for Junior showmanship. Entries should be made through NAILE online system at livestockexpo.com or mail entry forms to NAILE, P. O. Box 37130, Louisville, KY 40233.
2. Exhibitors must be members in good standing with the Belted Galloway Society, Inc.
3. Animals must be registered or recorded in the Belted Galloway Society Herd Book or other Society recognized Herd Book. Animals must be in good physical condition and typical of the breed in conformation. "Good physical condition" shall include but not be limited to the absence of any infectious condition such as ringworm or warts.
4. Original registration or recordation papers will be required at check in. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be allowed to show.
5. Bulls over 12 months of age are required to wear a nose ring, either temporary or permanent and must have a lead attached when being lead.
6. All bulls exhibited must have two descended testicles. No cryptorchid bull will be allowed.
7. Bulls exhibited at 16 mos. of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate documenting they have passed a bull soundness exam.
8. Heifers exhibited born on or before December 31, 2016 (not in the cow/calf classes) must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy by a licensed veterinarian or verified by an accredited pregnancy blood test, or accompanied by a original certificate of embryo recovery. (this is subject to random spot checks)
9. Females that are 30 months or older must show in the cow/calf class with a calf at side. Calves exhibited in the cow/calf class cannot be over 230 days of age.
10. Open show only: Animals must be purebred and registered in the Herd Book to qualify for the purebred show. This will include purebred, properly marked heifers, bulls and purebred steers and purebred, mismarked heifers.
11. Percentage Belted Galloway animals must be recorded in the Herd Book to be eligible to be exhibited in the percentage Belted Galloway show which would include percentage heifers and steers.
12. Percentage heifers and steers may not be shown in group classes.
13. The order of the show will be purebred, properly marked heifers, cow/calf, bulls and group classes, followed by purebred steers, percentage steers, purebred, mis-marked heifer and percentage heifers.
14. All Grand Champion and Reserve Champion animals shall be DNA verified at the Society's expense.
15. To compete in Junior Showmanship classes with an animal, the Exhibitor must be a Junior member of the Society and be 8 years of age or older. **No bulls over 7 months** of age may be used in showmanship and any animal deemed unruly or dangerous while in the ring can be dismissed at the judge's discretion. Only one handler per animal will be allowed in the ring during Showmanship.
16. Substitution: Should any entry be substituted for another no new fees are required. However registration papers must be submitted with the request for substitution. Substitutions must be made by November (*to be announced closer to the date.*)
17. The show committee reserves the right to split over-enrolled classes and combine under-enrolled classes.
18. The show committee reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include any injection of gas, solid or liquid under the skin to alter conformation, any additions of artificial tail heads or polls, any surgical alteration of the animal's shape, as well as any dyeing of coloring which alters the animal's natural color pattern. Artificially filling animals internally (pumping) is strictly prohibited.
19. Exhibitors are responsible for making sure entries are in the staging area before their classes are called. Exhibitors that do not enter the show ring within 3 minutes of the announcer's final call, forfeit the right to compete in that class.
20. Decisions of the judges are final except where mistake, fraud or misrepresentation is proven. Complaints, if any, must be tendered in writing to the Show committee. cost of any resultant investigations shall be borne by the complainant if allegations are dismissed, or by the exhibitor against whom the complaint was issued, if allegations are proven correct.
21. All protests must be made within 24 hours of the show.
22. Interference with or disrespect shown to the judge by any exhibitor during the performance of the judge's duties shall be deemed grounds for immediate disqualification.
23. Exhibitors must obey all rules of the Belted Galloway Society, Inc. and the North American International Livestock Exposition or be disqualified. Failure of exhibitors to follow the rules and release times shall not be allowed back the next year.
24. Exhibitors will be able to set up (*to be announced closer to the date*)
25. Unattended animals must be double-tied with halter rope plus neck rope or two halters, two ropes.
26. All animals will be required to be weighed and measured. No exceptions.



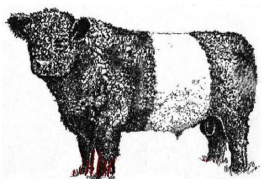
