About bulls ... Before advertising a young male be sure he is well conformed, tracks properly, has good legs and feet, and exhibits good weight gains. We recommend including data on his birth weight, 205-day weaning weight, and yearling weight. If he's reached breeding age (around 16 months), it's definitely a plus to have his semen checked for quantity and motility, and uniform scrotal development (two normal sized testicles). **It is required that registration numbers be included on bulls advertised for sale in the classifieds.**

High Steaks Carcass Contest 2019

Get your steers ready! The High Steaks Carcass Contest will be held in conjunction with the 2019 GLBGA Field Days on June 8-10, 2019. This event will be the second championship for Belted Galloway carcasses ever held. There will be two division: Grain fed and Grass fed.

We want to make sure this is a world-class event, so we are offering some serious cash awards. The prizes are \$500 for first, \$250 for second, and \$125 for third, along with bragging rights within the Society. The event has sparked quite a bit of interest. The entry rules and forms are available on beltie.org under the Events Calendar or the GLBGA website in the upcoming events. (GLBGA reserves the right to pro-rate premiums based on the number of entries.)

Entries should be postmarked by May 15, 2019. Entries are limited. Steer check-in will be on Monday, June 4, 2019, from 8 am to 5 pm, and Tuesday, June 5, 2019, from 7 am to 9 pm. If you are coming or hauling in early, your beef can be held and rested at my farm, Wisconsin River Farm or one of several other GLBGA farms.

Beef will be slaughtered on June 5th. On June 7th, the beeves will be evaluated by a UW Extension livestock specialist according to meat industry standards. During the field day events, the beef carcasses will be available for viewing and the prizes awarded. As part of the tour, Belted beef tasting will take place.

“If I enter the contest what will I do with my beef?” Contestants will have several options. Wisconsin River Meats can prepare your beef for you. If prior arrangements are made, Wisconsin River Meats will have your beef processed to your specifications, frozen and ready to go home with you on Sunday. We will open our store on that day for you to pick up your beef. You also can leave it hang longer and pick it up at a later date.

Another option if you act early, will be to market your steer to Wisconsin River Meats. Wisconsin River Meats will buy grain fed Belted steers that grade select or choice. We will pay for them at the Wisconsin market price for the hot hanging weight. You can call John at any time for current market prices.

The High Steaks Carcass Contest will be an outstanding opportunity to see how your steers stack up against the best of our breed and a chance to make a name for yourself and your farm. This is a chance to earn some serious bragging rights as well as being an important part of our 2019 GLBGA Field Days.

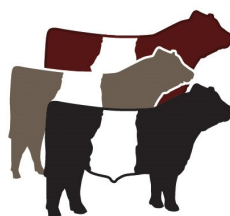

It was not very long ago that you would have never seen a Belted Galloway calf at the Hoosier Beef Congress (HBC), the Indiana State Fair, or at an IBCA junior cattle show, but now they are a regular occurrence and are even an attraction.

For the last 10 years Belties as everyone calls them have become a recognized breed and participant at the nation's largest "youth" cattle show. Every year approximately 1,200-1,500 prospective show calves are assembled and shown at the Indiana State Fairgrounds during the first weekend of December at the Hoosier Beef Congress (HBC). This show is sponsored by the Indiana Beef Cattle Association (IBCA) and managed by a large group of HBC volunteers. It is usually the first time most of these calves have been off the farm and in the show ring, and was specifically designed to become a feeder program for the IBCA Junior and Indiana 4-H shows to follow. The HBC's goal is to get the calves and kids ready early, so they show better throughout the year.

As a direct result of the ground work and acceptance of the Belted Galloway breed at the HBC, the Belted Galloway breed was later added to the list of eligible breeds of cattle that could be shown at the Indiana State 4-H Fair in 2013. Since then, Belties have participated and been a part of the Indiana State Fair 4-H show and the IBCA junior cattle shows.

As with all good things it is "time for a change." I have been the current Belted Galloway breed manager for both the HBC and the Indiana State Fair 4-H cattle show, has decided it is time for him to step down from these responsibilities, and has chosen Jason Bales of Larwill, IN to take his place as the HBC and Indiana State Fair Belted Galloway Breed Manager. Jason has supported his son, Sawyer, who has shown Belties at the HBC, The Indiana State Fair, and all over the state of Indiana at many IBCA Junior cattle shows for the last several years. Jason will be a terrific asset to the HBC and Indiana State Fair in the future. 2018 Fall Council Meeting

Summary

The 2018 fall Council meeting was called to order at 7 pm November 12, 2018 in Louisville, Kentucky by President Dawson Masters. Present: Jack Bagley (VA), Jon Bednarski (KY), Randy Hall (ME), Greg Hipple (IA), Janie Tripp (MS), Dick Williams (SC), and Executive Director Vic Eggleston (WI). Representing the US Beltie News, Leanne Fogle. Absent: Michael Crittenden (UT), Keith Jones (SC).

Secretary's Report. Registration data through September 30, 2018 as follows: Regular, 804; Junior, 105; Associate, 8; Life, 143. The following registration transactions were reported through September 30, 2018: Bulls, 170; Purebred Female, 819; Appendix, 75; Transfers, 905.

Treasurer's Report. Society funds in checking: \$38,958.28. Society funds in savings: \$10,901.45. Society funds in a certificate of deposit: \$157,741.50.

Committee Reports

Advertising and Promotion – Jon Bednarski (KY). Jon Bednarski attended the World Galloway Conference in Australia. One hundred international Galloway and Belted Galloway breeders attended who toured five Galloway and Belted Galloway farms. Ten countries were represented.

The Belted Galloway Society will host the World Galloway Conference in November 2020 in Louisville, Kentucky during the North American International Livestock Exposition followed by an extended tour. A video has been created for the event highlighting the tour and conference itinerary. A website will be created for the conference with an attendance goal of 100-150 guests. Preliminary fees for the cost of the extended tour are \$500-\$600. The host hotel will be finalized. The Society has budgeted \$5000 to host the event and spent \$2500 to-date. Jane Bradley (AUS) will provide oversight for the event. Multiple speakers will be available. Sponsorships will be studied. Planning is 90 percent complete.

Foundation – Scholarship – Vic Eggleston (WI) Three A.H. Chatfield Scholarships were awarded in 2018 and were featured in the Belted Galloway Journal. One applicant requested a delay in receiving funds and that request was granted.

Executive – Dawson Masters (TX) During the 2018 Spring Meeting the Belted Galloway Council, a motion was voted upon that would not allow mismarks in the 2018 National Show. The Executive committee met and discussed revoking the motion and adding mismarks to the 2018 National Show so that exhibitors who had already planned their show string would be able to show mismarked animals. The Executive Committee made the recommendation to the Show Committee to include the mismarked purebreds in a separate show. The Show Committee accepted the recommendation of the Executive Committee.

Information and Technology – Greg Hipple (IA) The committee studied the development of Belted Galloway APP for smart phones. Because of the expense of development (approximately \$10,000), and the limited function of an APP (information is accessible on beltie.org

and the clrc.ca), the committee did not move forward with developing an APP.

Junior Belted Galloway Association – Janie Tripp (MS) Donations for the National Kathi Jurkowski Belted Galloway Junior Show have totaled \$3010. The funds held in the Foundation's BGJA account will finance the remainder of the show. Twenty juniors are showing with approximately 40 animals entered. Tripp has been approached requesting a junior national for junior members. She has asked for feedback and ideas to plan an event. A show camp will be hosted at Klover Korner Farm in Rockton, IL on a first-come basis with information published in the newsletter.

Long Range Planning – Vic Eggleston (WI) Vic Eggleston shared information regarding identical twin bulls who were DNA and hypotrichosis tested. The twins that are made from one egg and their DNA and hypotrichosis testing were identical.

Newsletter – Leanne Fogle (IL) Beltie.org is updated and changed several times per week with new ads, calendar items, administrative updates, etc. by EDJE (covered under their administrative umbrella fee.) During 2017 expenses for beltie.org totaled \$1146. As of November 1, 2018, beltie.org revenue from ads is \$800. During the February 2018 meeting, the \$10 fee for placing photos with advertisements on beltie.org was waived. Fifteen farms placed photos of their sale animal on beltie.org. The calendar of events page is now linked to the home page of beltie.org for the most up-to-date information. Video clips of the 2018 Fryeburg Fair have been added to promote the breed.

The newsletter office did a survey of the success rate of ads placed on beltie.org and posted in the US Beltie News from March 1, 2018 to September 30, 2018. The response rate to the survey: 30 farms responded. 24 farms did not respond. Of the 30 farms who responded: 20 farms sold their animals through advertising; 10 farms did not sell their animals. Of those 10 farms who did not sell animals, 6 were selling bulls only.

Society Show and Sales – Dawson Masters (TX) There have been administrative changes to both the National Belted Galloway Show and the Premium Sale held in Louisville, Kentucky during 2018. Mike Jones (GA) was hired to conduct the Premium Sale. Facebook and Twitter blasts have promoted the Premium Sale. Banners have been made to feature sponsorships for webcasting of the Premium Sale and show sponsors of both the open and junior shows.

New Business.

Approved a \$750 GLBGA funding request for the 2019 Carcass contest. \$750 for 2019.

Requested that the Show and Sale Committee study and revise the Point System during 2019.

2019 Spring Council meeting: March 23, 2019 in Fredericksburg, Texas.

2019 National Sale: April 27, 2019 in Fryeburg, Maine.

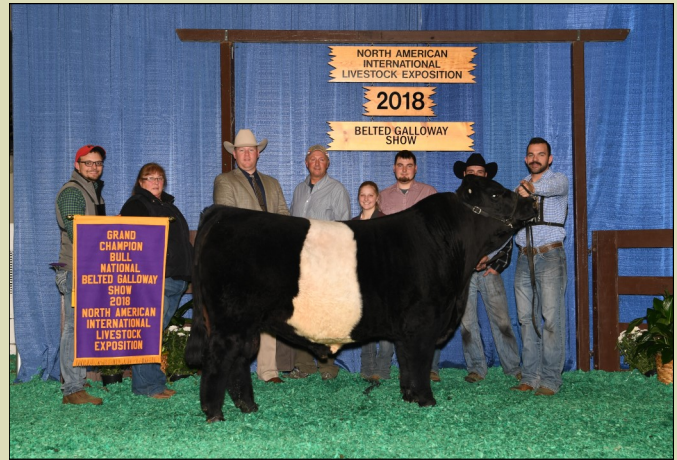

The 2018 Belted Galloway Society Premium Sale proved to be a big success with outstanding consignments of open heifers, bred heifers and bulls plus top genetic embryo packages, an embryo pregnancy and semen from some of the most noted bulls in the breed. The crowd was noticeably larger than in recent years and bidding was active and rapid.

The open heifers were especially strong with an average of \$3,130 on seven females with a top of \$5,100 on Lot 11 HCS Erin. 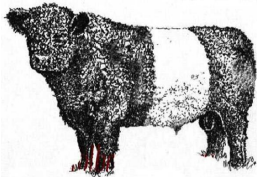
