Jon Bednarski, LaGrange, Kentucky

Hello from the “Bluegrass State” of Kentucky. I am serving as the current Belted Galloway Society Treasurer, the chairman of the advertising and promotion committee, and I am also the past president of the Belted Galloway Society during 2012-2013. The name of my farm is Sherwood Acres.

My wife Sylvia and I came to owning our first Belties in 2003 in a rather unique way. Our daughter had been taking riding lessons for a few years and she entered a drawing for a saddle. Several days later we received a call saying she’d won the saddle. As father daughter relationships sometimes go, I was convinced that we needed a horse for the new saddle. With no land or farming experience behind us, we purchased 50 acres of fallow ground. We started the process of building a new home, barn, and transforming the land into a farm.

Within a year, Sylvia and our two children, Kristin and Kyle, purchased three Belted Galloway heifers for Father’s Day. We were off and running in the beef business.

In 2005, we participated in several farmers’ markets in metro-Louisville. With 25-years plus in sales and marketing, I knew I could sell our beef to consumers. I just needed to know how to raise and care for them. After a year in the Cooperative Extension’s Master Cattlemen’s Program, and getting on the board of our county’s conservation district, I felt I had some of the tools needed to succeed in raising beef cattle and of course a few horses.

As beginning farmers, one of our first goals was to preserve and protect the environment and make our land better than we found it. The relationships we formed with the University of Kentucky Extension Service, the state and county conservation district, and the Kentucky Cattlemen’s Association gave us the tools we needed to find our way.

As our direct marketing beef business grew, we added another 100-acre farm in the adjacent county and then a 52-acre lake farm. This allowed us to do a little boating while farming and enjoying our new grandchildren.

When I became the Society’s president in 2012, Sylvia and I made a pledge that we would visit one-member farm in each state. We fell just short of the lower 48 goal by three states, but still have plans to complete those. Just prior to that time, we sold our cow/calf herd and began raising about 50 Beltie steers each year for our beef business.

My passion for the breed and the Society continues to grow. Plans are now being finalized to host the 2020 World Galloway Congress here in Kentucky at the North American International Livestock Exposition. Our guests will have the opportunity to visit many interesting destinations along with educational events. We could have attendees from over 14 countries so I hope many of our Society members will support and join us in 2020. About bulls ... Before advertising a young male be sure he is well conformed, tracks properly, has good legs and feet, and exhibits good weight gains. We recommend including data on his birth weight, 205-day weaning weight, and yearling weight. If he's reached breeding age (around 16 months), it's definitely a plus to have his semen checked for quantity and motility, and uniform scrotal development (two normal sized testicles). It is required that registration numbers be included on bulls advertised for sale in the classifieds.

Spring Vaccinations in Cattle

Your spring vaccination and processing program can include a few very important steps to maintain the health of your herd. The definition of spring vaccinations can vary depending if you are talking about fall born calves and early January and February show calves versus yearling heifers and bulls. Either way, being prepared to vaccinate, deworm and castrate your calves in the spring is a sound management tool to maintain healthy animals as they move through your production system. Often, this will be the last time your cows and calves are handled before headed to grass for the summer.

For calves two to six months, vaccinations should include two rounds of Infectious Bovine Rhinotracheitis (IBR), Parainfluenza Type 3 (PI3), Bovine Respiratory Syncytial Virus (BRSV) and Bovine Viral Diarrhea (BVD). When given 3 to 6 weeks apart, the second injection (booster) will improve the immune status tremendously over just one injection. These upper respiratory vaccines are very important once the calf's maternal antibodies begin to wear off and the calf's own immune system begins to be competent. Complete these first three vaccine protocols prior to weaning your calves when possible.

The second group is called the seven-way blackleg (clostridium) vaccine. The individual diseases that are covered by this vaccine group are ubiquitous and very aggressive. There are still train wreck cases out there when this vaccine is dropped from protocols. Talk to your local veterinarian about adding strains as needed in your area: *Cl. hemolyticum* (red water disease), *Cl. perfringens type A* (jejunal hemorrhagic syndrome) or *Cl. tetani* (tetanus). Make sure you are having post mortems performed on animals that die of sudden death in order to tailor your vaccination program to fatal events in your operation. As with the upper respiratory vaccines, a single vaccination with most Clostridial vaccines does not provide adequate levels of protection and must be boosted within a period of 3 to 6 weeks from the initial vaccine. After the initial two shot se-

ries, an annual booster in adult cattle is sufficient.

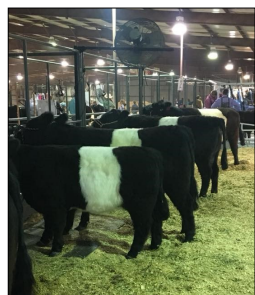
If the calves are not going out to grass, and will be commingled, dry-lotted or both, the following vaccines are critical: *Mannheimia haemolytica*, *Pasteurella multocida* and *Haemophilus somnus*. These bugs are the big players in bovine respiratory disease (BRD) complex. Depending on the product and the likelihood of disease outbreak in your herd, a single vaccination (even though labeled as a single injection) may not be protective enough. Consider the past performance of your cattle, disease prevalence and risk when determining whether or not to add a booster to your protocol, regardless of product labeling.

Heifers need their official calthood vaccination (OCV) against Brucellosis between 4 and 12 months of age, depending on the state regulations where you live. A veterinarian is charged with administering this vaccine. In most states, heifers that do not receive an OCV vaccination cannot be sold as a breeding animal after 12 months of age. Brucellosis causes Undulant Fever in humans and is under state control to prevent devastating economic losses to the beef industry.

Breeding stock born in the spring will be ready for their pre-breeding vaccinations in the following spring. Typically, two sets of vibrio and lepto vaccines should be on board prior to their first breeding. Leptospirosis is contagious from cow to cow; wild animals such as skunks, raccoons, opossums and rats can transmit the infection through their urine as well. Leptospirosis is also contagious to humans. Vibriosis is transmitted exclusively sexually; therefore, if there will not be a bull on your premise, you can skip this one. Now there is something you do not hear very often!



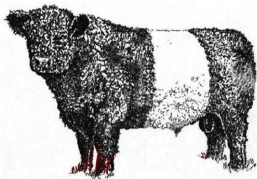
