Greetings from the mountains of Utah. Since buying my first Belties in 2003, I've been told that Belties aren't real cows, and Beltie owners aren't real cow people. The second accusation is probably true in my case. I don't particularly care for cows, ironically. I've acquired a great deal of respect for Belted Galloway cattle, however. Allow me to illustrate.

We've begun to receive our first frost here at 6,000 feet in mid-September as I write this. I typically have more fall grass than I have cows to eat it, so I invite my dairyman neighbor to run his dry Holsteins on the lush irrigated fall grass while my over-conditioned Belties are sequestered on the remains of dry summer grass. At first frost, the finicky Holsteins stop grazing, and I save what remains for the commercial cattlemen as they descend from the high mountains with their bland black cattle before weaning and shipping in late October. Once they leave, I toss in a bull and let mine pick as third grazers until snow covers the ground for good sometime in December. My cows always look plumper than the commercial cows that just left. For ease, and to not interfere with my skiing and snowboarding, I gave one commercial fellow fall feed for a few years in exchange for feeding hay to my cows, along with his that boarded here, through the winter. We had to give it up because the amount of hay required to carry his cows left mine too fleshy through the winter. It's been years since I've been bothered by commercial operators in the know about my cows.

To echo President Masters from March, Belties are not commercial cattle in the classic sense. I embrace that. What they are, from my experience, is the perfect small farm breed. They are incredibly easy doing cattle that raise a calf that people will stop to take a picture of, and they taste fantastic. Both of our boys are off to college, so I just joined FFA (father farms alone)! Our place is for sale as my wife, Mary Kay, and I enter "operation downsize," and we are shrinking the herd. As a result of that and an unusual run of heifer calves, I

was not able to provide my usual customers with beef this fall. I found some corn-fed black replacements, but most passed. They claim that my grass-fed Belties have ruined it for them.



Sure, they finish slower, but they are incredibly efficient feeders along the way. The meat is lean, tender, and flavorful. If the point of a beef breed is to produce delicious meat, I'm of the opinion fifteen years on that I chose wisely when I picked Belties.

I've enjoyed my time with these undeniably attractive cattle here at the Sailin' C Ranch. I've been fortunate to meet great friends from

all across the country in my quest for animals that appeal to me. I appreciate the efforts of all those who came before, and those currently in the breed, as stewards and advocates for this remarkable and very real breed of cattle.

About bulls ... Before advertising a young male be sure he is well conformed, tracks properly, has good legs and feet, and exhibits good weight gains. We recommend including data on his birth weight, 205-day weaning weight, and yearling weight. If he's reached breeding age (around 16 months), it's definitely a plus to have his semen checked for quantity and motility, and uniform scrotal development (two normal sized testicles). **It is required that registration numbers be included on bulls advertised for sale in the classifieds.**

Council Elections

Past President Greg Hipple (IA)

Council elections will be held during the Annual General Meeting in Louisville, Kentucky. Jon Bednarski (KY), Keith Jones (SC), and Dick Williams (SC) are on the ballot to be re-elected to serve another term. Paul Tarap will begin to serve his first term on Council. A term consists of two years, and each member of Council may serve two consecutive terms. Our Council works on a volunteer basis. We are so appreciative of their willingness and dedication to our breed. Regular and Lifetime members are eligible to vote either by mail before the deadline set forth on the ballot below or in person at the Annual General Meeting in Kentucky in November. Each membership number is allowed one vote.

Jon Bednarski (KY) grew up in Vermont and spent summers working on his uncle's dairy farm. He moved to Kentucky in 1980 with Northeastern Log Homes/Classic Post & Beam Homes as their regional manager. Jon started his Beltie herd in 2002 and now direct markets his beef through farmers' markets, health food stores, and several restaurants. He has served on the Society's Council, also as an officer on the Executive Committee, he has chaired the Advertising and Promotion Committee that generates breed promotional materials, traveled across the United States interviewing Belted Galloway breeders featured in the US Beltie News, and his role is vital to the production of the annual Belted Galloway Journal. Jon is active in his county and has served on the Conservation District Board and as chairman of the Cooperative Extension District Board. Jon and Sylvia Bednarski's Sherwood Acres Farm won the prestigious Kentucky Leopold Conservation Award, and later honored as recipients of the NCBA Region One Environmental Stewardship Award at National Cattlemen's Convention during 2014. He serves on the Kentucky Cattlemen's Executive Board and Kentucky Beef Council.

Keith Jones (SC) has a backstory with the Belted Galloway breed beginning in 1997 when he started as the herdsman for Sue and Gene Drew at Driftwood Plantation in Awendaw, South Carolina. He grew up on a cattle farm in Indiana on a Charolais cow-calf operation, showing cattle, and marketing breeding stock. Keith earned a degree in animal science at Purdue University. He has participated in many Belted Galloway sponsored sales and has exhibited cattle throughout the United States. The farm also has semen, steer, and heifer projects for youth. Keith has traveled throughout the United States, Canada, Scotland, New Zealand, and Australia viewing Belted Galloway cattle and judged a Belted Galloway show in Melbourne, Australia. Keith returned to Council in 2017, previously serving two terms in the early 2000's. Keith and his wife Pam, now the owners of Driftwood Plantation, continue the legacy of the Drew family, and develop potential show animals, breeding stock, bulls, and sell semen/embryos.

Paul Tarap (CA) grew up in 4-H and has had cattle throughout his life. His family has been involved with cattle since the late 1800's in the Napa Valley. Paul's introduction to the Belted Galloway breed came through his wife, Ailene. She has been breeding Belties since 1987. Currently, the Tarap's Stewart Ranch has approximately 70 Belties, and they have brought in new bloodlines from various states. Besides Belted Galloways, they show American Galloways, Simmentals, Miniature Horses, and Quarter horses. For the past 18 years, Paul has been the ranch director for a non-profit at-risk youth organization called "Ag4Youth". Paul has 52 students who raise swine, meat goats, lambs, and market steers to compete and sell in our local fair. The profits earned are kept in accounts that are not available to the youth or their parents until the child reaches 18 years of age. Monies are used for higher education or trade school. During October and November 2018, the Tarap's will be showing in Louisville, Kentucky and visiting the Fryeburg show in Maine.

Dick Williams (SC) is a native of northwestern South Carolina and graduated from Clemson University in Civil Engineering. He continues to maintain a private land surveying practice that he established 45 years ago in his hometown of Travelers Rest, South Carolina. Dick served as a trustee for the American Simmental Association from 1992 through 1999. He and his wife Lisa became involved with Belted Galloway's in 2000 and operate Stones Throw on a portion of Lisa's family farm in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains, just south of the North Carolina border. Through an embryo transfer program, Dick and Lisa produce embryo Belted Galloway calves while maintaining their recipient cow herd of approximately 30 commercial cows. Their goal is to produce genetically sound animals with proven heritage and performance.

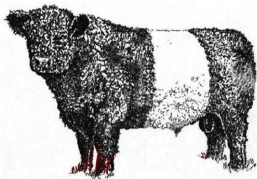
