## 20 Year Milestone — Chatfield Memorial Fund

The A.H. Chatfield Jr. Memorial Fund was established twenty years ago with the passing of Albert Chatfield Jr. of Rockport, Maine. Mr. Chatfield's legacy began in 1953 with Aldermere Farm's foundation of a half dozen females purchased from Harry Prock of Pennsylvania along with imports from Great Britain. The July 99 issue of this newsletter honored the 99.5-year-old Chatfield. Reflections included:

The late Jane Faul, Kentucky: *'We could easily insert a history of his accomplishments and honors here with development of one of the earliest and finest herds in the United States, the many committees worked on and offices held, shows judged, meetings hosted, foundation animals supplied to new breeders, the years he spent bringing Aldermere's frame sizes up ... Mr. Chatfield was a towering force behind the development of the Belted Galloway breed in this country, and we won't soon see his like again.'*

Then President Dick Anderson of Vermont: *'Of all the qualities I associate with this fine gentleman, one stands out above all*

*secretary, an accounting of the breeding stock, and the outlook for next year as you could ever imagine. This inspired us, as I'm sure it inspired many other Beltie lovers, to set our sights high in aspiring to enjoy the merits of this wonderful breed.'*

In the spring of 2000, President Marlin Sherbine announced that the first \$500 scholarship was awarded. Fast forward twenty years to 2019 and the fund now awards three \$1000 scholarships annually in remembrance of A.H. Chatfield Jr., his vision for the Belted Galloway breed, and education.

*others. No matter his age (in his mid-80s when I met him) every conversation turned on the future – his future - the Society's future. Whether it was a new bull, barn, house, pasture, innovative fencing, halter breaking technique, breeding concept, or new Society direction, he had to show it to me or otherwise involve with his initiative or future dream. ## A.H. Chatfield Jr. Memorial Scholarship Application

The 2019 A. H. Chatfield, Jr., Memorial Scholarship applications are available. Three \$1000 scholarships are awarded annually. Forms may be requested from Executive Director, Victor Eggleston, Phone (608) 220-1091; email: [executivedirector@beltie.org](mailto:executivedirector@beltie.org) or may be accessed at [www.beltie.org](http://www.beltie.org).

The recipients must meet the following criteria:

1. Be a member of the Belted Galloway Junior Association, the Belted Galloway Society Inc., or be a child or grandchild of a BGS member;
2. Be either a graduating high school senior or a college student, or be enrolled in an advanced education program;
3. Submit the completed application form along with a written essay explaining why you are the best possible candidate for the scholarship. Added consideration will be given to applicants enrolled in animal/agriculture-related courses, and those experienced with Belted Galloway cattle. Extracurricular and out-of-school activities will also be taken into consideration.

Completed applications must be submitted to Executive Director, Victor Eggleston, N8603 Zentner Rd., New Glarus, WI 53574, and must be postmarked by April 30, 2019.

## Lease Agreements

1. A lease agreement must be on file with the CLRC by July 1, 2019 for animals to be shown under the lessee's name.
2. Exhibitor points will be awarded to the lessee of the animal.
3. If animal is shown under the lessee one day of a multiple day show, the animal must continue to be exhibited under the lessee for the duration of the entire show. The lease cannot be terminated halfway through an event. The owner of the leased animal may use the animal for group classes.
4. Lease fees are waived for juniors members.

to enlarge her pasture. She has also created a herd health management plan with her local veterinarian. Elizabeth is A.I. certified. She has three of her females ready to calve through artificial insemination and due in 2019.

During 2017, Elizabeth won a heifer calf from the New England Galloway Group Heifer project. Later that fall, she bought two heifers that she had leased from Aldermere Farm. Her first Belted Galloway calf was born on the farm in March 2018. After meeting Elizabeth, I asked Elizabeth to take home one of my heifers after the 2018 National Show this past November. Elizabeth is involved with the New England Galloway Group. She shows her cattle in the state of Maine, at the Big E 4-H shows, and the National Belted Galloway Show in Louisville.

I asked Elizabeth what is most exciting about the Belted Galloway breed. Elizabeth is a bright, can-do young woman, and I'm happy to call her my friend. I think she said it best in her own words:

*'It's exciting for me to be a Belted Galloway breeder because of the people involved in this breed and showing Belties in Maine allows me to connect to many other Belted Galloway breeders in the country. One thing I have found with Belted Galloway breeders is they are always willing to answer questions and help me learn to make educated decisions. A few of my mentors are Heidi and Jake Baker (ME), Dawson Masters (TX), and Diane Gushee (ME). My 4-H leader Heidi Baker has helped me a lot with my herd. Heidi got me interested in the breed and had helped me with the start of my herd. Jake Baker has helped teach me how to clip my heifers for shows, and how to prepare my animals for the show. My first year showing, my Aldermere heifer was purchased by Dawson Masters. I showed her in Maine and brought her to Louisville, Kentucky. I met Dawson, and I learned how he became involved in the breed. Dawson's passion for the Belted Galloways helped inspire me to become more involved in the breed. Another mentor of mine is Diane Gushee. She has answered many questions and is also there to support me as well as many other youths across the country. My long-term plans are to continue raising Belted Galloway cattle and bringing in new genetics to expand my herd. I am hoping to raise show cattle as well as market steers for local sales.'*

## Looking Back

It's always fun to look back and reminisce about days gone by. We recently found this gem. In the winter of 1998, Galloway/Belted Galloways carried the day in the market beef carcass class at Toronto's Royal Winter Fair, winning the first three places in an all-breeds class of 37 steers.

Canadian Galloway Association's Mike Earley of Kerwood, Ontario, accomplished this remarkable task using Galloway/Belted Galloway crossbred genetics.

First place carcass:	Galloway cross dam x Main/Limo/Angus bull.
Second place carcass:	Galloway/Limo dam x Limousin bull.
Third place carcass::	Three-quarter Belted Galloway/cross dam x Maine/ Angus bull.

## Reminder—Mandatory Testing Requirements for Bulls

All bulls born on or after January 1, 2018 are required to be DNA and hypotrichosis tested before registration. Fees for the mandatory DNA and hypotrichosis testing are \$65. The Executive Director's office will generate the paperwork for samples to be submitted to UC Davis.

Bulls born on January 1, 2018 or after, may be registered with

the CLRC for \$30 *after the DNA and hypotrichosis testing are completed*. Council reduced the registration fee to \$30 for all bulls born on January 1, 2018 or after to accommodate the mandatory testing.

The Executive Director's office will notify the breeder with the test results and an authorization for registration.

Bulls born before January 1, 2018 are not required to be DNA or hypotrichosis tested and fees for registration will remain \$50.

## New England Survey at UMass

What do entry-level beef cattle farmers need to know to be successful in New England?

Regional universities and technical schools are updating their programs to make sure that our future beef farmers have the knowledge, skills, and training experiences needed to meet region-specific demands and challenges in the beef industry.

We need your input in a roughly 20-minute New England Beef Farmer Skills Survey --- a vital contribution to the future of the industry in New England. Participation is voluntary, and personally identifiable information is not collected with responses.

We expect survey findings to benefit the region's beef cattle industry by

creating a greater pool of well-prepared young farmers: (1) to serve as apprentices or employees, (2) to expand the infrastructure of the beef industry in New England, and (3) to purchase land, animals, and equipment from farmers considering retirement without family successors.

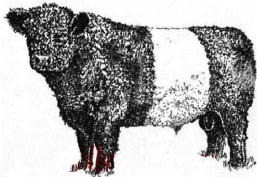
