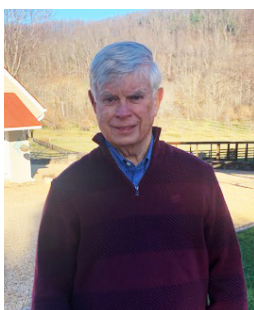

The Society by laws stipulate a requirement for a quorum to conduct the meeting. However, SINCE Covid-19 concerns may once again limit attendance, we are investigating the possibility of telephonic participation by members who are interested in "attending." That option will be discussed in the November Newsletter.

## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE CONTINUED...

We hope to make it easier for members to vote this year. We will allow the voting via email option rather than the paper ballot process used in the past that resulted in very few responses. You can send your email ballots to [executivedirector.bgs@gmail.com](mailto:executivedirector.bgs@gmail.com) or you can respond to the poll being sent out via email to all membership.

For all of the NEW members of the Society, the Bylaws state "at each Annual General Meeting the members shall elect 3 Council members for a term of 2 years each. The members shall also elect by separate ballot a Council member to fill each unexpired term which may exist on the Council"

Notwithstanding the complications resulting from not having an Annual Meeting in 2020 and unexpected Council resignations during 2020, the Society's by laws state that a Council member may serve for no more than 2 two year terms; and the Council can appoint someone to the Council due to a resignation but that person must stand for election for the next Annual General Meeting. The ultimate outcome is to elect 3 individuals to the Council for a term of 2 years.

Hope this helps everyone understand the situation in front of the Society's governing process.

You will also find on page 3 in this newsletter an update by Ailene Tarap (CA) on the status of bidding for two auction items intended to raise funds for the Junior Scholarship program.

## PAUL TARAP (CA)

Paul Tarap grew up in 4-H and has had cattle throughout his life. His family has been involved with cattle since the late 1800's in the Napa Valley. Paul's introduction to the Belted Galloway breed came through his wife, Ailene. She has been breeding Belties since 1987. Currently, the Tarap's Stewart Ranch has approximately 70 Belties, and they have brought in new bloodlines from various states. Besides Belted Galloways, they show American Galloways, Simmentals, Miniature Horses, and Quarter horses. For the past 18 years, Paul has been the ranch director for a non-profit at-risk youth organization called "Ag4Youth". Paul has 52 students who raise swine, meat goats, lambs, and market steers to compete and sell in our local fair. The profits earned are kept in accounts that are not available to the youth or their parents until the child reaches 18 years of age. Monies are used for higher education or trade school. Paul and Ailene will be attending both the Fryeburg show and the NAILE show to give support to the Society.

## TOMMY FEY (TX)

Tommy Fey grew up raising cattle as 4-H and FFA projects and became interested in Belted Galloways when he purchased one as a Christmas present for his wife. They have been raising Belties since 2010 at Silver Tin Ranch in Texas. They immediately wanted more Belties and their herd has grown ever since. Fey says the breed has wonderful characteristics and he has enjoyed becoming acquainted with fellow Belted Galloway breeders over the years. Fey has served the Southwest Belted Galloway Association as a Director for 6 years including Vice President and President positions. He also has a passion for showing cattle which includes assisting youth with their show cattle prospects. "I know that showing is not for everyone but it provides great exposure for the public to become familiar with the breed." says Fey. Fey recently began his own hoof trimming business and travels across Texas serving the needs of area cattlemen and cattlemen. Hoof trimming has allowed him to develop stronger connections with youth and answer their questions on showing their animals.

## VICTORIA OATLEY (RI)

Victoria first gained experience with Belties when her grandfather Vernon Oatley managed the show string for Anderson Hill Farm, in Rutland, VT. She tagged along with her family when they showed the cattle at Eastern States and at the NAILE. These shows are where she met the Prock's of Prock Ridge Farm.

In 1998, at six-years-old, she was given the opportunity to show one of the Prock's heifers in showmanship. This was her first time showing a Belted Galloway at Eastern States. A few years later, Lorraine Prock and her daughter, Lori Guptil persuaded her to put

in an application for the Heifer Project. Later that fall, to her surprise, she was awarded a heifer named Spurrwick Magnolia. Victoria didn't know it then, but Magnolia would change her life forever as she was the foundation of her Belted Galloway Herd today. Currently, the Oatley family keep 40 head of cattle on their farm.

Victoria appreciates these cattle for their longevity and fleshing ability. She strives to better her herd and the breed. She believes educating the youth involved in the breed to be extremely vital for it's future. She is an active member of the NEGG where she is the Belted Galloway youth coordinator. Victoria credits the NEGG heifer project and the many people who helped her, that allow her the opportunities she has today.

## PAT HIPPLE (IA)

Pat and her husband Greg live in eastern Iowa on their farm Sutliff Belties. Pat and Greg have 2 children and 5 grandchildren, who are just about old enough to enter the showing. They purchased their first Belted Galloway female in 1993 and the herd has grown to the current 34 head of registered cows and bulls. They sell freezer beef, breeding stock, semen, and occasionally feeder steers. One of Pats greatest pleasures is when the opportunity arises to help a new family begin their own Belted Galloway Herds. Several starter herds have come from Sutliff Belties.

Sutliff Belties has participated in many shows and exhibitions including NAILE, WBE, Midwest Classic, Heart of Texas. Pat hosted the Belties Unlimited Show in Iowa 5 times. Pat has served as a volunteer leader for Area 5 of the Belted Galloway Junior Association, has served on the annual meeting committee for several years, currently serves as the chair of the A.H Chatfield Scholarship Committee and serves on the Board of the Belted Galloway Foundation, Inc. Pat is currently serving her second year on council after being appointed to fill the vacancy left by the retirement of Dick Williams (SC).

Pat has worked in banking 37 years, currently starting her 30th year at Solon State Bank. Pat feels it is an honor and privilege to be able to serve and give back to this organization.

## DON HENDERSON (NY)

Don Henderson has been involved in agriculture his whole life. He grew up working on the family dairy farm in the Catskill mountains, was active in the FFA, and showed livestock at county and State fairs with 4H. Don studied animal science in college and earned a degree in biology. He left the dairy industry in 1995 and started a horse farm with his wife Bonny in Geneseo, New York, to raise and breed thoroughbred and thoroughbred cross horses. In 2000 his wife opened her own large animal veterinary practice where Don has served as chief financial officer

and emergency veterinary technician. In addition, Don has managed the Neuromuscular Laboratory at the University of Rochester Medical Center since 1997, serving patients with Muscular Dystrophy and neurodegenerative diseases such as ALS. Don and Bonny purchased their first Belted Galloway cattle at the national sale in Fryeberg and have steadily grown a small herd of belties. He has a passion for the breed and is interested in starting new shows and Beltie classes in his region, to promote and advance the breed.

## TERRY ETHRIDGE (WI)

Nestled in a valley in northwest Wisconsin, TEK Cattle has been selecting Belted Galloway breeding stock for uniformity, conformation, and lower maintenance costs since 1990. Owned and operated by GLBGA Director and Treasurer Terry Etheridge and his wife Karlyn, TEK sells registered breeding stock, feeder steers, and pasture-raised beef.

Terry grew up in Princeton, Illinois, an active community two hours west of Chicago. His family owned a 360 acre farm, where Terry and his father maintained a large commercial grade Angus herd, ran a farrow-to-finish hog operation, and planted row crops. After graduating from college with a degree in mechanical engineering and marrying Karlyn, Terry left the family farm and moved to Eau Claire, WI to work as an engineer with National Presto Industries. While he enjoyed his "day job", one thing was missing...cattle.

Following research on the attributes of various breeds, the couple selected Belted Galloways for their medium build, docile temperament, efficient foraging ability, double-hair coat that allows the cattle to thrive in harsh northern Wisconsin winters, and strong mothering instinct. In January 1990, TEK Cattle purchased two foundation heifers from Ed & Diana Throckmorton, Bittersweet Farms, Harbor Springs, MI.

Along the way, Terry and Karlyn met other Beltie breeders, forming life-long friendships. In 1992, Terry joined Bob Rolland, Dick Frey, Vic Eggleston, and Jerry Jurkowski to form the Great Lakes Belted Galloway Association, Inc. Terry has held many positions throughout his tenure with GLBGA, serving as President, Breed Superintendent for World Beef Expo, Director, and Treasurer. Karlyn is also active in the group. The family showed Belties locally, regionally, and at World Beef Expo, and exhibited cattle at the Minnesota State Fair for many years. TEK Cattle continues to showcase the breed at Wisconsin's Farm Technology Days. In addition,

daughter, Talya, and son, Tyler, were among the region's first BYG members. Locally, Terry is involved with North Central Wisconsin Cattlemen's Association.

TEK Cattle consists of 90 head of black Belted Galloway breeding stock, calves, and feeder steers. Terry has seen an increased demand for locally-raised beef as more people want to know where their food comes from, and many consumers are looking for leaner, healthier beef. He believes the Belted Galloway breed is well-suited to meet this demand and is excited about the future of the breed. He looks forward to continuing to work with fellow breeders to ensure a strong future for Belties in the cattle industry.
