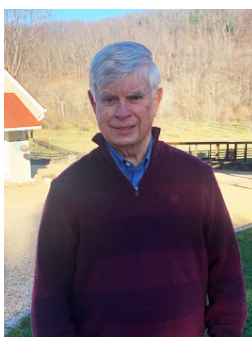

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



President Jack Bagley

Every year in January or February the President of the United States visits Congress to give an address called The State of the Union.

The status of the economic and foreign relations issues of the time determines the theme of how the country is doing. The President lists a series of accomplishments of the past year, and makes a series of recommendations and challenges for Congress to consider in order to address some of the issues facing the country.

I thought I would copy that tradition to compose a State of the Belted Galloway Society as my term as President ends and we look ahead to 2023.

In a word, the Society and the Beltie breed are in a period of transition with many accomplishments from 2022 but several challenges facing the Society and its membership. We can grow or we can wither as we approach the 60th Anniversary in 2024 since the establishment of the Society.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

We were able to have a smooth transition in the Executive Director position from Dr. Vic Eggleston (WI) to Greg Hipple (IA).

We created a new position of Breed Promotion and Member Outreach. Corinna Caron was selected for this position and has focused on an updated and easier to navigate website and the creation of specific programs dedicated to Juniors, including a Junior Council. We have developed up-to-date job descriptions for these positions, as well as the Editor role that Jayde Reilly fills. All positions have metrics by which performance will be measured every two years.

We have developed a common set of rules for shows that are eligible for points; I accept responsibility for not giving members more advance notice of changes.

We have established a practice where the leaders of the Regional Groups are invited to sit in on Council meetings as non-voting members in order to be able to have better access to Council deliberations without waiting for publication of the Minutes months later.

We have produced the 2022 edition of the Beltie Journal albeit smaller than in the past.

The Society also has some **GOALS/CHALLENGES** in front of us:

An effort on my part early in my term as President was to review the by-laws (which have not updated in more than ten years) was interrupted by COVID-19 and other issues brought before the Council. Nevertheless, we have not accomplished that goal. In the meantime bylaws have been a limiting factor by which the council has had to adjust their processes in order to conduct business

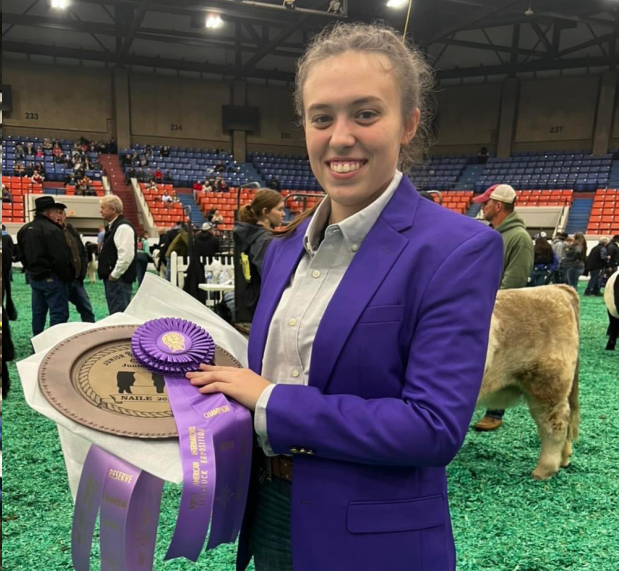

Online DNA / Hypotrachosis applications can be found at www.beltie.org. please note, if you request a test kit via this option, please check your spam folder the next business day as often time the kit is ending up there when requested using this option.

Test kits can always be requested via email at executivedirector.bgs@gmail.com by sending the following: Calf name, Calf identification (tattoo), Calf sex, Calf color (black, dun, red), Complete sire information, Complete dam information, Complete owner information type of test requested (parentage/ Hypo, both). Please note if multiple parents are an option, include them all.

I have been receiving questions on the reasoning for the raise in membership fees from \$40 plus the CLRC fee of \$10 (\$50) to \$80. Simply put, the Belted Galloway Society has not increased any fees since 2010. The fees charged to the Society have increased just over \$30,000 a year in the same time period. The council made the change to the membership fees, that include absorption of the \$10 transaction fee charged by CLRC in an effort to lessen the annual losses currently being realized.

As members of the Belted Galloway Society, you should know, the officers and members of the council are your representatives. They are available for your discussions, concerns and successes. PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Continued President's Message...

A Draft Report by the Long Range Planning Committee received at the recent Council meeting needs additional input from the Council before sending a draft to the membership for comments and approval. We must accomplish that goal in 2023.

MEMBERSHIP has been declining in total the past few years notwithstanding there are many new members joining each year.

BGS total membership decreased from 1067 in 2021 to 967 as of September 2022. This total includes approximately 200 NEW members over the past year. The new members total compared to the total members indicates more than 200 members did NOT renew in the past year. This is not a good trend and requires Council attention, especially since we raised membership fees effective Jan 1, 2023.

Fees for membership in the Belted Galloway Society are currently one of the lowest of all cattle associations. With this adjustment, we are in the middle of the range. We determined that additional revenue would be required to invest in website revitalization and promotional materials for the functions. In addition, we need to continue to work with CLRC and others on cost efficiencies for registrations and transfers and overall support to the Society.

MEMBER ENGAGEMENT

I earlier referenced that 200 new members have joined BGS in the past year. Each edition of the newsletter lists each new member with an address and phone number. That same edition of the news asks the new members to share their story about why they joined BGS and/or a little bit about their farm/ranch etc. No one ever responds to that invitation. The feature articles in the Annual Belted Galloway Journal seem to be the only instances where we highlight a member's operation or animals. The new members come from almost every State and have a common goal...: to be a member of BGS. Let's hear from you!

We have four Regional organizations that have been formed over the years to bring its members in those geographical areas together for periodic meetings, shows, junior activities etc.

New England Galloway Group has 61 members.
Great Lakes BGA has 106 members.
Southwest BGA has 48 members
Western BGA has 38 members.

It would be nice to have others in different parts of the country. Is anyone interested?

This data indicates there are many members of the BGS who are not connected to any Regional Group. With ZOOM and other internet vehicles, Geographic location does not

have to be factor in today's technological world to preclude joining one of the Regional Groups in your section of the country. The Council has members from Washington to Maine. Moreover, the Council is able to conduct business via Zoom for all our meetings.

INFORMATION SHARING AND TRANSPARENCY

When I became a member of the Council one of the criticisms I heard was the lack of transparency or "knowing what's going on" in the Council. It takes time for the minutes of each Council meeting to be available since the next Council meeting has as its first agenda item to Approve the minutes of the previous meeting (which sometimes could be months). In response, I tried to recap as much as possible the items that were discussed at each meeting in my President's letter without jeopardizing the process for approving the official minutes.

I also initiated the procedure of inviting Regional Group leaders to sit in on Council meetings so that those individuals could answer questions coming from their organization's membership.

The process for choosing members to be candidates for Council vacancies also needs to be more transparent. If members are willing to be candidates in a multi-candidate election with no guarantee of the results of the voting process, I believe the Council will benefit from new ideas proposed by interested candidates without jeopardizing what has become the tradition of having some regional representation.

Having only three options for three Council vacancies on a ballot may be the primary reason why these elections generate few ballots. In the most recent election for three Council members, (with a provision for write ins), less than 10% of eligible members cast their votes by mail or electronically.

I would like to welcome the election winners who are the newest members of the Council. Dana Jacobsen (WA) and Kim Lohman (IA) and the re-election of Tommy Fey (TX) to a second two year term.

At the most recent Annual meeting, I suggested it might be interesting to have a special publication and/or programs in 2024 to celebrate the 60th anniversary of the formation of the Belted Galloway Society in 1964. All it will take for this idea to come to fruition is for a group of people, including some of older, and longer serving, members of the Society to volunteer to contribute memories, pictures or stories, etc to make the publication a "memory." It would also be a nice promotional item for future use in recruitment and retainment of members.

Interested parties are welcome to participate. Let me know if you are interested.





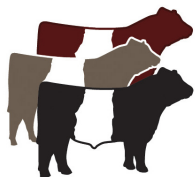
